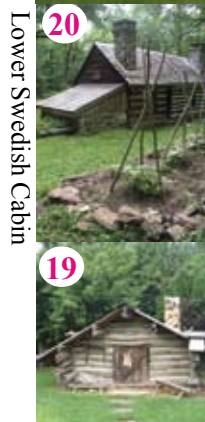

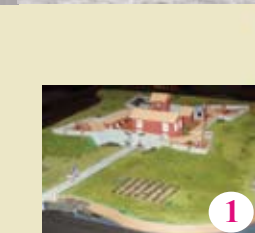

New Sweden colony, founded in 1638, was the first permanent European settlement in the Delaware Valley. The sailing vessels *Kalmar Nyckel* and *Fogel Grip* arrived at a natural rock landing. This site is still visible today on the Christina River, in Wilmington, Delaware. Among the first pioneers in New Sweden were Swedes, Finns, Dutch, and one African. They lived peacefully with the neighboring Lenape Indians.
